Q: What is The Kamloops Project?

A: On Wednesday, Feb. 29, our community will be documented in photographs and short videos. Coordinated by the Daily News, this community project aims to record how Kamloops-area residents spent Leap Day, their extra calendar day of 2012.

Q: How does the Daily News plan to do this?

A: We're asking residents to submit a single photograph taken on Leap Day, Feb. 29, along with a short write-up of how they spent the day.

Q: What is the purpose of this endeavour?

A: As with the first Kamloops Project in October 2010, our goal is to document the collective humanity of our community by recording thoughts, feelings and actions. We want to create an ongoing community archive through this project series, one that helps us understand who and what we are as a people, and one that gives future generations a historic glimpse into what life was like in Kamloops during this generation.

Q: How is the Daily News planning to present all of the photographs and write-ups?

A: We're going to share the information in a couple of ways. We will produce a special print publication featuring a selection of the people documented on Feb. 29 along with a full website featuring everyone who was documented that day.

Q: How can I be a part of this historic documentary?

A: On Feb. 29, the www.kamloopsproject.ca website will feature a Submissions Form on which you can upload a single photograph of yourself (jpeg format, less than 5MB), taken at any time during Feb. 29, along with a maximum of 100 words telling us about how you spent the day.

Help out a relative, friend or neighbour who doesn't have access to a camera or computer by volunteering to snap a digital picture and by recording how that person spent his or her extra day.
